- Adults typically keep an eye out for changes in behavior or memory loss in their parents. Older

- "About 500,000 more Americans are diagnosed with dementia every year," said Aaron Van
 - Valkenburg, manager of Pierce County Aging and Disability Resources. "Most family caregivers
 - are unprepared to manage the daily challenges that take place in supporting someone suffering
 - with dementia. Providing proper care for your family member, while maintaining care for
 - yourself, are necessary components to managing such a difficult situation."

 The numbers are in, and they're headed in the wrong direction. According
 to new statistics from the
- Federal Trade Commission, Washington consumers lost more than \$135 million to fraud in 2021, nearly double the amount lost in 2020
 - It seems the scammers are gaining the upper hand in the fight for our hard-earned dollars. Con-artists
- are becoming ever more sophisticated in their tactics, and new scams are emerging at an increasing
- pace. Even the most informed consumer can find themselves struggling to keep up.
- To help consumers fight back, AARP is joining forces with the Washington State Attorney General's
- Office, Pierce County Human Services, BECU and Nomorobo to hold a free "Tip-Offs To RipOffs" online event aimed at helping Tacoma area consumers stay a step ahead of the scammers.
 - The free online event will be held from 10:00am 11:30 am on Wednesday, May 25. Participants will
 - hear about the latest scams targeting the Tacoma area, including a journey inside an actual fraudulent
- boiler room to show step by step how scammers manipulate our emotions and steal our money.
 - Through a unique new partnership with the call-blocking service Nomorobo, participants will also learn
- how they can gain real-time access to the specific robocall scams flooding phone lines in their area.
- With these and other early warning tools, consumers will gain the inside track on recognizing some of

the newest scams before the cons have a chance to make their pitch.

Farmer's Market Vouchers Available Starting May 2nd The Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program provides low-income seniors with vouchers to purchase

- produce from participating farmers' markets and farm stores. Registration begins May 2nd and will
- continue until all vouchers are claimed. Due to the public health concerns of COVID-19, vouchers will
 - be mailed this year rather than distributed in person. Vouchers will be mailed within 4-6 weeks of receiving complete applications.

Who is eligible? Eligible applicants must live in Pierce County and be:

- 60 years old or older (55+ for Native American or Native Alaskan)
 Have valid government issued identification
- Low-income (below 185% poverty level). Monthly income less than \$2,096 for 1 person household,
- \$2,823 for 2-person household, 3+ person household add \$728 for each additional person

- Callers should be prepared to provide their name, birthdate, household size, income, phone number and mailing address.
- Staff members can assist to complete an online application OR callers can be mailed an application to

complete, sign, and return to Pierce County.

Things to remember about applying for Farmer's Market Vouchers:

- 1. The quickest way for eligible residents to receive vouchers is to submit an online application.
- 2. Registration begins on May 2nd call waiting times on this date can be long. Consider calling later in

the week or register online to avoid long hold times.

- 3. Calls to register or applications received prior to May 2nd will not be accepted.
- 4. Farmers' market vouchers are provided to eligible applicants on a first come, first serve basis.
- 5. Incomplete applications will be returned to the address provided on the application, which could

result in the delay or denial of vouchers.

- 6. Pierce County is not responsible for lost or stolen vouchers and is unable to replace vouchers.
- 7. Applicants will choose between receiving \$40 in vouchers OR \$80 in vouchers on the initial

application. Selections on the application are considered final for the 2022 season

Did you know that there are tens of thousands of people living and dealing with dementia in Pierce County? Did you know that you can be part of ensuring they are included, valued, and cared for in their community? Dementia Friendly Pierce County is an initiative through Lutheran Community Services Northwest, and is leading the way to remove stigmas and creating a culture of compassion that is formed around health, justice and hope.
